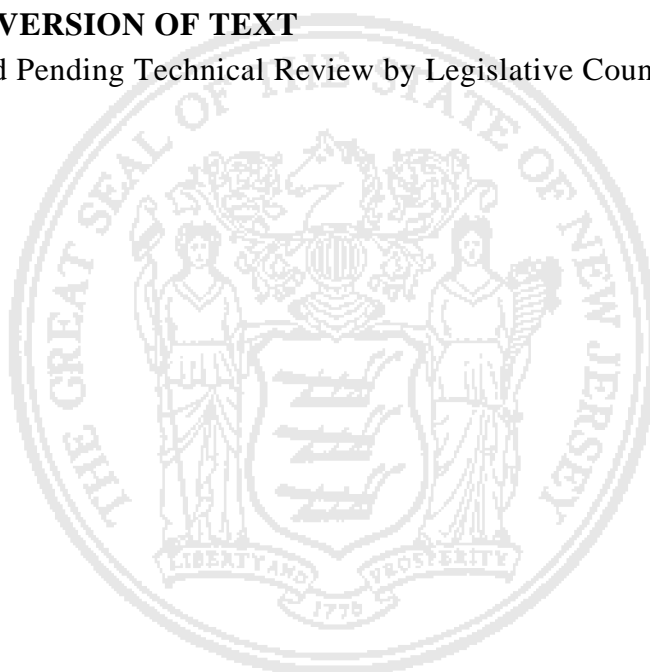

Supplemental appropriation of \$250,000 to DMVA for grant to Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program.

1 A SUPPLEMENT to "An Act making appropriations for the support of  
 2 the State Government and the several public purposes for the fiscal  
 3 year ending June 30, 2001 and regulating the disbursement  
 4 thereof," approved June 30, 2000 (P.L.2000, c.53).

 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
 7 of New Jersey:

 9 1. In addition to the amounts appropriated under P.L.2000, c.53,  
 10 there is appropriated out of the General Fund the following sum for  
 11 the purpose specified:

 27 STATEMENT

28  
 29 This bill appropriates \$250,000 to the Department of Military and  
 30 Veterans Affairs for a grant to the Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program. The  
 31 Civil Air Patrol is a congressionally chartered not-for-profit corporation  
 32 which provides important support services to the United States Air Force,  
 33 New Jersey State Police, United States Drug Enforcement Agency and  
 34 United States Customs Service. The Civil Air Patrol's Cadet Program  
 35 enrolls approximately 600 young people from 12 to 18 years of age in  
 36 aerospace education, flight orientation and community service programs.  
 37 The Cadet Program currently relies solely upon voluntary contributions.  
 38 The requested appropriation will allow the Civil Air Patrol to increase  
 39 participation in its Cadet Program and to enroll those who might  
 40 otherwise lack the financial means to do so.
